Joint Venture

The Danish company FLS Industries and General Dynamics have gone into quite an unusual joint venture, transforming Denmark's second largest military airfield, Karup Airport, into a maintenance station for civilian and military aircraft. The two companies will run the maintenance station jointly, and the future plans are to mostly service civilian aircraft. FLS Industries is the biggest independent company in the flight maintenance business in Europe.

General Dynamics has a stake of 24% in the new joint venture, while FLS Industries, together with some smaller companies and the Danish Ministry of Defence, control the rest. FLS Industries is not active in flight maintenance in the USA. They are, however, the largest company in cement manufacturing machinery in North America.

Negotiate Commercial Leases

Regardless of the size of one's office, rent is one of the largest costs of doing business, particularly in New York City. It could be an economical move to review any commercial lease with less than two years to go.

According to recent estimates, there are currently some 70,000,000 square feet of empty office space in Manhattan alone. The cost of renting space has dropped dramatically, due to a higher supply than demand.

Commercial tenants who are nearing the end of their current leases should consider renegotiating for more favorable terms, or start looking around for new and more affordable office space. In fact, they should examine both alternatives closely. Looking for new space can be done quite easily by letting the brokers do most of the work, and assist in the negotiation with the landlord. Unless otherwise agreed, brokers' commissions are normally paid by the landlord. Commercial tenants should be aware that a reduction in rent is only one area of negotiation in this tenant's market. Landlords may give lengthy periods of abatement of rent payment at the beginning of a lease or at its extension. They are now more willing to give in on various forms of "passalong" or "additional rent", which in the past often have been sources of extra profit for the landlord. Currently, it is very possible for the tenant to obtain a work letter whereby the landlord pays for some or all improvements or construction work required by the tenant at the beginning or extension of the lease. There are several other opportunities for a tenant to improve his position with his present or new landlord during this buyer's market.

Since the commercial real estate market in this city tends to be cyclical, the market could again be in the landlord's favor within a few years. Therefore, check your leases and consult a real estate expert.

George Jensen Auction

Some forty pieces of prized Georg Jensen silver was auctioned off at Christie's New York in late January. Part of the renowned private McCarthy-Cooper art/decorative arts collection, these silver master pieces drew many bids from here and abroad.

A rare pair of five light grape pattern candelabra, designed by Georg Jensen ca. 1935, along with a more contemporary fish platter 1954, and a jug, both designed by Henning Koppel and made by Georg Jensen silversmithy, were among the offerings.

The Georg Jensen silver collection was sold for a total amount of USD 632,000 which is over USD 100,000 higher than Christie's median appraisal.
