Tribute to Jacob Riis

The Museum of the City of New York will pay tribute to Jacob Riis with the exhibition "A Century Apart: Images of Struggle & Spirit, Jacob Riis and Five Contemporary Photographers" which will be on display at the museum January 18 through September 13, 1995.

On January 19, 1995 A SPECIAL EVENT benefitting the JACOB RIIS SETTLEMENT HOUSE will take place at The Museum of the City of New York. This event will be cohosted by the Danish American Society, the Danish American Chamber of Commerce and the Consulate General of Denmark. Jacob A. Riis, a renowned photo-journalist and social reformer, was born in the town of Ribe, Denmark, in 1849, and in 1870 he emigrated to the United States, where his first years were filled with personal hardships, and where, as a police reporter for the New York Tribune, he acquired a first-hand knowledge of New York's poorer districts.

As he worked his way up the social and economic ladder, he never forgot what he himself had experienced at the bottom, and he fought hard to better the lives of those less fortunate than himself.

In 1888 Jacob Riis founded the JACOB RIIS SETTLEMENT HOUSE. Each year Riis House provides social, educational, recreational, and human services to over 2,000 young people, adults and senior citizens.

The Tall Ship DANMARK Visits New

The Tall Ship DANMARK arrived from Baltimore at South Street Seaport in New York on Monday, September 12, 1994.

During 5 beautiful late summer days in New York the cadets and the crew had a chance to immerse themselves in all the joys of the Big Apple. Captain Ole Peter Nielsen hosted a number of activities to promote Danish American trade. On Friday, September 16 at noon the DANMARK set sail for Stamford. The 60 year old tall ship sailed up the East River for the first time ever, and only careful maneuvering and a low tide let the ship slip under the Brooklyn Bridge. Both the Danish as well as the American press was present to cover the event which was very successful. The DANMARK was the tallest ship ever to have passed under the Brooklyn Bridge.

In Stamford, CT, the DANMARK took part in the annual Stamford Denmark Race on Sunday, September 18. Cadets. officers and even the Captain were crew for a day on smaller ships, and many were on the winning boat in their particular division. It was a beautiful day with lots of wind for the sails and a clear blue sky to enjoy.

ISS on NY Stock Exchange

The Danish cleaning company ISS, International Service System, is now listed on the New York Stock Exchange (symbol ISG) and has a new head of its US operations. ISS, the world's largest cleaning company, was traded on NYSE for the first time Thursday October 28, 1994. Three million stocks were sold at a price of \$14 1/8. As of November 1, 1994, Dennis Spina was appointed Chief Executive of ISS' US subsidiary, which operates in 37 states and has approx. 45,000 employees.

Dennis Spina was CEO of Suburban Propane since 1991, he replaces Henrik Slipsager who left ISS this Summer. JL

Denmark's National Bank Names New Governor

Ms. Bodil Nyboe Andersen has been appointed the successor of Europe's longest sitting central bank governor, Erik Hoffmeyer, when he retires on January 1st after 30 years as Head of Denmark's National Bank. The appointment of Ms. Nyboe Andersen, who has been on the Board of Governors since 1990, brings to five the number of women central bank governors in Europe. Formerly a lecturer in economics at Copenhagen University, she served on the Board of Andelsbanken and then Unibank before joining the National Bank.

Novo Nordisk & the FDA

Novo Nordisk is rapidly improving the standard of its insulin production units in Copenhagen as required by the US authorities. Last February the Federal Drug Administration (FDA) inspected the production facilities of insulin and growth hormone in Copenhagen.

Again this November the FDA checked the insulin production and concluded that minor improvements needed to be done.

Strategic Location of Copenhagen Cited

In a recent issue of the weekly newspaper The European Copenhagen, one of eight European cities featured, was singled out for its strategic location at the "future epicenter of northern Europe betwen the Nordic and Baltic countries on one side and Germany and the rest of Europe on the other".

Programs in the works to accomplish this: the Scanlink scheme of roads, rail bridges, and tunnels linking Scandinavia and Zealand with mainland Europe; the Øresund link between Malmø and Copenhagen which will be ready before the end of this decade; and the almost completed link across the Great Belt which, without using ferry boats, will unify the Danish road and rail networks for the first time.

Between Kastrup Airport and the city of Copenhagen, the Danish government has designated a three square kilometer urban development zone - Ørestad - to be developed over the next 30 years.

Warm Welcome to Greenland

According to a recent issue of the weekly newspaper the European, one of the hottest European destinations of 1994 were in the coolest climate. Greenland experienced a 100% growth in the number of tourists as some 8000 holiday makers made their way to the vast Atlantic island. Most people come for the wilderness, the dog sledge tours and Ilulissat, the world's fastest moving glacier which races along at 90 feet a day. In the summer coastal temperatures can reach 60-70 degrees F.

The Greenland tourist board hopes that the number of visitors will reach 12,000 next year.

Rise in Danish Exports

Deliveries in Denmark's manufacturing industry rose by 10% in the third quarter of this year compared with the same time last year.

Exports went up by 10% and home market deliveries went up 9%. New orders rose 15%, and producer prices by 1%. The European

Northern Feather Corp. Continues Court Battle

The court battle in the aftermath of the collapse of Nordisk Fjer A/S continues. On November 14th Inge Lydia Rasmussen received a suspended sentence after pleading guilty to gross negligence in the handling of information concerning the financial status of the corporation.

For 32 years Ms. Rasmussen was the personal secretary to CEO Johannes Petersen. She was convicted also because she was aware of corporate financial misconduct as early as 1988. The last official report from Nordisk Fjer showed a positive balance of DKK 784 million (\$115 million). At the collapse of the company in November 1990 there was a deficit of DKK 1.4 billion (\$230 million).

On November 22 a Copenhagen court began the criminal trial against four former Nordisk Fjer directors accused of fraud. The trials are expected to last until the end of 1995. "Nordisk Fjer Estate in Bankruptcy" has sued the former management and accountants for DKK 100 million in damages. The Danish Maritime and Commercial Court, where the case is being tried, has decided to uphold any action in this matter until the criminal case has been concluded.

GN in Friendly Takeover of US Company GN Elmi/Navtel, subsidiary of GN Store Nord, has offered \$8 per share for the Laser Precision Corporation Inc. setting the price for the company at \$41 million. Laser Precision Corp. produces fiberoptic testing equipment and has an annual turnover of approx. \$24 million.

GN says that the US company fits exceptionally well into the Elmi/Navtel group, which specializes in measuring instruments and systems for the tele- and data-communications industry. The Board of Laser Precision is

very happy with the Danish offer and has recommended that

their stockholders accept it.

North Americans Look at Danish Technology

Danish producers of machinery used for secondary wood products, which adds value to the raw material, are seen as having a good chance of doing business in North America. After severe overcutting and subsequent cut-backs in the amount of wood lumbered here it is necessary to create new jobs by processing the wood, but there is no local technology available to do that. A Canadian delegation has just visited Denmark to look at gluing and laminating machinery from companies like Obel-P-Products, Kallesø A/S, System TM, Grama and Sennerskov A/S.
