### Danish Entrepreneurship Thrives in Silicon Valley

Touchwave Inc. is an American company based on Danish ideas and backed by Danish capital. The entrepreneur, Samir Lehaff, his Bridge Ventures Fund II company, and 300 Danish investors are building the company in Palo Alto, hoping to sell it in 3-5 years. They decided to go straight to the US market because of the greater potential here. The high-tech company makes so-called Webswitches, an advanced switchboard product based on Internet Protocol on the Internet that integrates telephony and data. Samir Lehaff is known for founding companies like ecommerce software company The Vision Factory and the photographic companies Phase One and ScanView. VH

SAS to Open a Daily Non-Stop Service Between Chicago and Stockholm

Scandinavian Airlines is to open a new, daily non-stop service between Chicago and Stockholm, the capital of Sweden, in October this year. At the same time SAS will change the timetable of its present daily Chicago-Copenhagen service. Scandinaviabound passengers will thus have a choice between an afternoon departure to Stockholm or an evening departure to Copenhagen.

#### Heinesen Optimistic about Tele-Merger

The entry of another US telecommunications company into Tele Danmark's circle of owners will not change anything for the company's customers or employees, says Chairman of the Board, Knud Heinesen. The proposed merger between SBC Communications and Tele Danmark's main stockholder Ameritech has been a cause for concern for many, but according to Knud Heinesen the company strategy will remain the same. There is also much to gain from the close co-operation with the Americans such as access to new markets and technology. However, analysts find it worrysome that Tele Danmark after several months has still been unable to attract a new CEO to replace Hans Würtzen - one reason presumably being lack of autonomy in the company, which to a great extent will be run from the US. Analysts are also concerned that SBC will concentrate its efforts on taking over more US telecommunications companies rather than investing further resources in Europe. Ameritech, in the meantime, has put pressure on the Danish government to make it drop proposed legislation to take away Tele Danmark's monopoly. If that happens, important strategic decisions regarding the Danish company will be removed from the country and made elsewhere, says Tele Danmark in a response to the government's proposal. VH



**Changing of the Tourist Guard** A new face will represent Denmark in the US as Head of the Danish Tourist Board from July 1st. Dorthe Hansen takes over the reins from Jarl Boye-Møller who after almost a decade in New York will head the Danish Tourist Board in Southern Europe. covering France, Italy and Spain from a base in Paris. Dorthe Hansen has been rising steadily in the ranks at the Danish Tourist Board's New York office since her arrival six years ago. The past two years she was elected Rising Star of the Year by the prestigeous Travel Agent Magazine. As she takes control of the New York operation she will enjoy the benefit of a three year budget for marketing and developing of tourism to Denmark, which the government has just approved in recognition of the importance of the tourist industry which creates annual revenues of 43 billion DKK and 80,000 iobs in Denmark. Business tourism, cruises, branding, co-op marketing with US companies, and ways to exploit the Internet are some of the areas that have her attention. VH

The Force is with Lego

Danish toy maker Lego has clinched an exclusive deal with Lucas Licensing Ltd. to make "Star Wars" construction sets and figurines worldwide. The multi-year agreement, which marks the first property licensed by the Lego Group, gives the company the right to produce and sell toys based on the three new Star Wars movies as well as the original Star Wars trilogy. Lego president and CEO Kjeld Kirk Christiansen says the agreement is a major step for the Lego Group worldwide, bringing together two very powerful brands that will entertain and inspire children around the globe. According to people familiar with the deal, Lego expects to gain 1 billion dollars in sales from Star Wars products over the next eight or nine years making the line one of the company's biggest. On top of that, Lego also gets a leg up on its competitor Hasbro, which last October paid for an "exclusive" licensing arrangement for Star Wars toys. VH

Californian Bio-Tech to Denmark

Structural BioInformatics, SBI, has decided to establish a subsidiary in Copenhagen. The Danish company will be named SBI/AT (Advanced Technology) and function as the California-based bio technology company's European headquarters. The core brainpower of the subsidiary will be the cousins Henrik and Jakob Bohr, who are descendants of Nobel prize winner Niels Bohr, both professors at DTU together with professor Søren Brunak. SBI was referred to the Danish researchers by Copenhagen Capacity that also linked the company with co-investors Dansk Udviklingsfinansiering and Dansk Kapitalanlæg. The joint Danish-American investment is 40 mio. DKK. SBI's CEO Edward Maggio says that the research of the Bohr cousins and Brunak combined with the location and perceived neutrality of Denmark made it the perfect choice for its European headquarters. VH

Superfos Acquires Road Construction Company

Superfos has acquired the road construction company Gator Asphalt based in Sarasota, Florida, as of June 1998.
Gator Asphalt is engaged in asphalt production and surfacing. Its annual production volume is 400,000 tons. The company employs 110 people and reports an annual turnover of approx. \$25 mio. BM

#### Kompan Hopeful Despite US Problems

Severe problems in the US market seem to be subsiding for Kompan. The Danish maker of playground equipment still had problems in 1997 when 7 mio. Dollars needed to be infused into the US subsidiary to replenish its capital, and the situation was one of too low profit margins and too high costs. But following a re-organization and a shift in product focus Kompan is expecting major improvements in the US in 1998. So far, two US managers have been ousted because of the difficulties. First Troels Engholm in March of 1997, and most recently Henning Braginsky who only got 7 months in the corner office. His replacement

is David Morgan who for three years has been in charge of the regional sales company Kompan Northeast, Inc. VH

#### Lundbeck in US Alliance

The Danish pharmaceutical company
Lundbeck has entered into a long-term
strategic alliance with one of its US partners,
Forest Laboratories. The agreement includes
development and marketing of new
medicine for Alzheimers and anxiety attacks
plus an improved version of Lundbeck's
most successful product, the anti-depressant
Cipramil. Forest has invested more than 200
mio. DKK in the project.
Lundbeck has had major problems in the US
with its Serdolect schizophrenia drug, and

with its Serdolect schizophrenia drug, and lost its Japanese partner with whom it was to develop that product in the US, but the Cipramil success compensates for that and is expected to boost Lundbeck's revenues by 20-25 pct. in 1998.



Hammershøi Exhibit at Guggenheim The Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum will be the sole United States venue to present Vilhelm Hammershøj (1864-1916): Danish Painter of Solitude and Light. This international loan exhibition, on view from June 19 to September 7, 1998, is jointly organized by Ordrupgaard, Copenhagen, and the Musée d'Orsay, Paris, and presents approximately 60 of the artist's most important paintings, lent by museums and private collections in Scandinavia, Germany, France, England, and the United States. Vilhelm Hammershøj was born in 1864, one year after Edvard Munch, his better-known Norwegian contemporary. Although he established a name throughout Europe during his lifetime, Hammershøj's international reputation waned after his death in 1916 at the age of 51. This rediscovery of his work outside Denmark was declared by art critics to be comparable in importance to the rediscovery of both Vermeer and Georges de la Tour.
